2.0 Call to Order

5.7 AT, BD and RD Associates and Liaisons to Council

Council's Governance Task Force (GTF) proposed three motions intended to clarify the current status of three existing categories of associate (AT, BD, RD), their respective intern categories; their respective liaisons to council; and the IDIBC liaison to council.

Chester moved to amend the text of the second motion proposed by the GTF. The motion to amend was not seconded.

Motion: to table the proposed motions until such time as Council's Associates Resolution Working Group completes its research and deliberations with agreement by all Council members not to bring opposing motions or points-of-order with regard to associates and their liaisons in the interim.

That Council sets aside those directives currently found in council policy 5.7.1 which require specified ancillary events to be held in conjunction with the annual conference, for 2012 and 2013.

8.0	POLICY CATEGORY:	PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE
8.1	POLICY FOCUS:	COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATIONS

8.1.1 The AIBC is committed to meeting its legislative requirement for receiving complaints and investigating the professional conduct of its [registrants] where appropriate in order to uphold and safeguard the public interest in maintaining appropriate standards of professional conduct and practice by [registrants].

Accordingly, the Executive Director will ensure that:

8.1.2 Reasonable steps are taken so that the complaint and investigation process accords with the appropriate principles of administrative justice and procedural fairness that apply to these stages of a professional conduct matter. The AIBC develops, implements and refines consistent, efficient and fair rules, procedures and guidelines for handling complaints and investigations.

[NB: In March 2001, the AIBC implemented *Rules for the Professional Conduct Process* (the “Rules”). Rule 1.2 reads:

The object of these Rules is to secure the just, speedy and inexpensive determination of every complaint on its merits as provided in the [*Architects*] Act and these Rules, preferably by consensual resolution but otherwise by adjudication by a Disciplinary Committee.]

8.1.3 The complaint and investigation process is monitored on an ongoing basis to ensure that the relevant *Rules*, procedures, and guidelines continue to meet a high standard of procedural fairness and administrative efficiency. The AIBC will also monitor and review the implementation and application of these *Rules*, procedures and guidelines on an ongoing basis to ensure maintenance of a high standard of procedural fairness and administrative efficiency.

8.1.4 The AIBC, through the Professional Conduct and Illegal Practice Board, will develop or refine *Rules*, procedures and guidelines on an ongoing basis to assist the AIBC staff and support committees in carrying out their tasks at the complaint and investigation stages.

8.0	POLICY CATEGORY:	PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE
8.2	POLICY FOCUS:	CONSENSUAL RESOLUTION AND DISCIPLINARY INQUIRY

8.2.1 Complaints of unprofessional conduct that have proceeded through the complaint and investigation process to the AIBC’s consensual resolution process or to a Disciplinary Inquiry may result in findings or admissions of unprofessional conduct by a [registrant].

Accordingly, the Executive Director will ensure that:

Consensual Resolution

NOTE: As a consequence of the August 2009 B.C. Court of Appeal decision in *Salway v. APEGBC*, the AIBC determined in September 2009 that it could no longer continue with its consensual resolution process until amendments to the *Architects Act* (the “Act”) had been secured. Policies 8.2.2 and 8.2.3 are therefore temporarily suspended, and policy 8.2.4 addresses the matter.

8.2.2 [A [registrant] facing an allegation of unprofessional conduct is offered a reasonable opportunity to engage in consensual resolution to resolve a conduct matter before the [registrant] is served with a Notice of Inquiry.

8.2.3 The AIBC, through the Professional Conduct and Illegal Practice Board, will monitor and evaluate the fairness and administrative efficiency of its consensual resolution process on an ongoing basis and make such recommendations as are necessary from time to time to improve this important complaint resolution process.

Disciplinary Inquiry

8.2.4 (Until such time as the *Act* has been amended to explicitly allow the AIBC to resolve allegations of unprofessional conduct by way of consensual resolution or other alternative resolution)all allegations of unprofessional conduct approved by AIBC Council by way of notice of inquiry must proceed to be heard by a disciplinary committee at a disciplinary inquiry. In order to preserve some of the flexibility, cost-effectiveness and public interest elements of consensual resolution, the AIBC will make reasonable efforts, in keeping with its public interest mandate, to negotiate with members and associates subject to a disciplinary inquiry to make joint submissions to a disciplinary committee with respect to agreed facts, liability admissions and/or penalty submissions.

8.2.5 Reasonable steps are taken to ensure that its Disciplinary Inquiry process accords with the appropriate principles of administrative justice and procedural fairness, and shall take such professional advice as is necessary to do so on an ongoing basis.

8.2.6 Reasonable efforts are made, through co-ordination with its external counsel, the Disciplinary Committee and the [registrant] facing the allegation(s) to ensure that any Disciplinary Inquiry is held in a timely manner.

8.2.7 In accord with the principles of administrative justice, a Disciplinary Committee shall provide written reasons for its decision within a reasonable period after conclusion of a Disciplinary Inquiry.

Appendices to the minutes: text of policies revised

- 8.2.8 The AIBC, through the Professional Conduct and Illegal Practice Board, will develop or refine appropriate *Rules*, procedures and guidelines on an ongoing basis that relate to the resolution of allegations of unprofessional conduct by consensual resolution or Disciplinary Inquiry.

10.0	POLICY CATEGORY:	ILLEGAL PRACTICE
10.1	POLICY FOCUS:	COMPLIANCE WITH THE <i>ARCHITECTS ACT</i>

- 10.1.1 In the public interest and on behalf of its [registrants], the Institute will make reasonable efforts to address the illegal practice of architecture through education and the enforcement of the *Architects Act* (the “*Act*”). The illegal practice of architecture relates to the unlawful use of the title “architect” or other terms implying registration with the AIBC; the actual ‘practice’ of architecture by a [non-registrant] outside of the exceptions provided in the *Act*; and the unlawful engagement of a non-architect to practise the profession of architecture.

Accordingly, the Executive Director will ensure that:

- 10.1.2 Sufficient resources are allocated to meet the Institute’s responsibilities with respect to enforcement of the *Act*, including maintaining a dedicated annual budget allotment for the funding of appropriate legal proceedings.
- 10.1.3 Illegal Practice procedures and guidelines are developed and/or refined on an ongoing basis to assist AIBC staff and the Illegal Practice Committee in carrying out their tasks with respect to the intake, investigation, resolution and appropriate publication of illegal practice matters.
- 10.1.4 Consultation and education efforts directed at prevention of illegal practice shall be undertaken with the public, local governments and [registrants].
- 10.1.5 Regular, informative communication regarding illegal practice matters is provided to [registrants] and the public.
- 10.1.6 Suitable legislative and regulatory initiatives are supported to improve alignment and consistency among and between the *Act*, BC Building Code and other relevant legislation and regulations, in an effort to improve compliance with the *Act*.
- 10.1.7 Consultation, cooperation and information-sharing between the AIBC and other professional regulators takes place to prevent and address the illegal practice of architecture by members of other professions.
